#### **Dislike**




### Report

Depending on the social media platform, you may be able to "dislike" a post. This is an easy way to object without engaging with the poster. A post that is antisemitic should always be reported on the platform.









#### **Comment**

The purpose of antisemitic posts are to spark controversy and instigate debate online. By engaging in posts publicly, you will only fuel the fire and encourage the poster. It is best NOT to engage publicly. If you want to engage in dialogue, send a direct message. Use one of the above mentioned methods of reporting antisemitic posts of people you do not know.



**Do not engage with people you do not know via direct messages.** To engage with people you know online around sensitive topics such as antisemitism, a direct message is the safest way and the most likely to result in a positive outcome.
